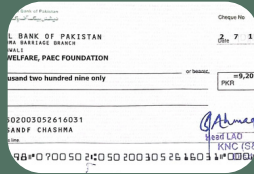

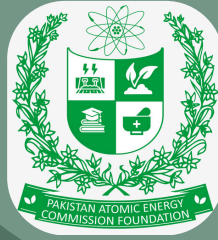

OBJECTIVE

Pakistan Atomic Energy Commission Foundation (PAECF) was established under Charitable Endowment Act in May 1994 for welfare of PAEC employees and their families in the time of peace and war by generation of funds through profit oriented units.

Other Grants

Religious Festivity Package (Rs. 5,000/-) is provided to all Christian employees on Christmas and other employees in SPS-1 on Eid-ul-Fitar. A handsome amount in the form of grants is provided for direct or indirect welfare of PAEC employees such as sports activities, cultural shows, entertainment activities, medicines, books, uniforms to marginalized populations surrounding the PAEC Projects.

Moreover, Centres for Retired Employees Welfare (CREW) are provided staff, utilities and other facilities so that retired employees can conduct their desired activities.
